SHS Families and Students,

Students have been working hard over the past two weeks to complete the Smarter Balanced Assessment (SBA) exams. All 10th grade students take the exams in both English Language Arts (ELA) and Math. If students do not earn a proficient score, they are given the opportunity to retest in 11th and 12th grade. SBA exams have many benefits for students and staff. If a student earns a Level 3 or 4, some colleges and universities will accept the score for placement into college-level English and/or Math (without needing to take an additional placement exam)

- ·The results provide valuable data to track student progress and compare results to those across the state
- ·Students can meet their graduation pathway through SBA testing, which is a graduation requirement
- ·Students can, if needed, earn competency credit for certain scores in ELA, Math, or Elective
- If you have any questions about these benefits, please do not hesitate to reach out to me or our counseling team.

We will soon be giving Advanced Placement exams (AP exams). These exams are for students currently enrolled in AP classes who have signed up to take the exam. By earning specific scores on the exams, students can earn college credits. Please see below for the exam schedule:

- **WAVE Scholarship** ~ Scholarship amounts vary depending on the recipient's education costs, including college attended, number of credits taken, and other financial aid received. Recipients will be awarded up to approximately \$3,800 per year for up to two years. Must be planning to attend a community or technical college in WA. 






Sequim School District Families,

As part of the state's effort to protect the health of all children, the Washington State Legislature passed the Engrossed Second Substitute House Bill 1139 in 2021. This bill addresses concerns about lead in school drinking water as part of a broader effort to reduce children's overall exposure to lead in the environment. Under the bill, the drinking water must be tested every 5 years in all public schools built, or had all plumbing replaced, before 2016.

The Sequim School District, in alignment with this legislation, is having water tested across all buildings.



The Washington State Legislature passed laws in 2021 that require lead testing of all drinking water outlets in public schools that were built, or had all plumbing replaced, before 2016. Initial testing is required by June 2026, and retesting is required every five years thereafter.

We partner with schools to sample and test drinking water, provide guidance on remediation, and assist with communicating the health effects of lead exposure. We test for lead to reduce exposure from school drinking water.



SCHOOL REQUIREMENTS



TEST

Partner with Department of Health or a contractor to sample and test drinking water.



ACT

Develop an action plan for remediating outlets with elevated lead levels.



COMMUNICATE

Communicate with students' families and staff about lead contamination in drinking water as required.
